"LOVE MAKES A FAMILY" ART EXHIBIT

Family Diversity Projects, Inc.

This photo-text exhibit presents photographs taken by Gigi Kaeser and interviews conducted by Peggy Gillespie and Jean Beard with twenty families whose lives are affected by schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder, major depression, anxiety disorders, and other brain disorders. The photos and text in this exhibit dispel harmful stereotypes, myths and misconceptions about mental illness.

"TOLERANCE ZONES" ART EXHIBIT

Artist Rosemarie McKeon

McKeon, a current MFA Visual Arts student at UCSD, presents a series of maps representing regional economic, social, and environmental tolerance issues. Her works include 1990 Census undercount areas, hate crimes, reported incidence of police abuse, Native American territory changes, SAT scores, her understanding of EHC's Toxic Neighborhood Campaign, and current controversial work covering the history of redlining in San Diego. The various maps resemble transparent shoji screens, which the viewer can move, interact with, and juxtapose one regional tolerance zone with another.

DIVERSITY PEER MENTOR PROGRAM

The goal of the Diversity Peer Mentor program is to promote positive campus climate and a genuine appreciation for diversity and multiculturalism within the university environment, through the facilitation of dialogue and interaction concerning issues of individual identity, group membership, and cross-cultural understanding. Teams of Diversity Peer Mentors are available to conduct customized workshops or dialogues around these issues for groups of student leaders, resident advisors, first-year students, or student organizations. The Diversity Peer Mentor program will be available beginning fall quarter 2000.


