REMARKS:

Asoka Mendis has had a ring-side seat for this month's long-awaited Halley's Comet flybys of the Vega I-II and Giotto spacecraft. He may have been the only U.S. scientist invited to collaborate with both the Soviets and the Europeans in the interpretation of data and photographs relayed to earth from the spacecraft. Before leaving for Moscow and Darmstadt, West Germany, Mendis said he expected to be able to offer the media a "quick postmortem" of initial observations of the comet when he returned.
