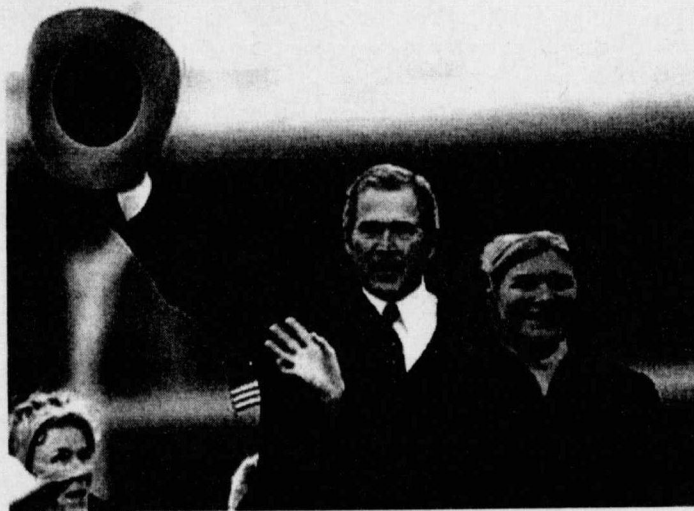
Clown says the resolution only falls short of abolishing the council permanently because it is indispensable as a resume padder and talking point at cocktail parties.

A sociology professor said that is highly dubious.

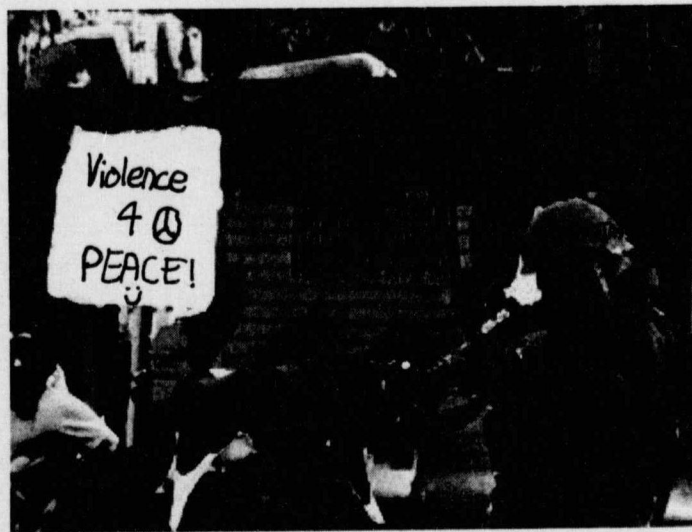

Clown Impeached, Paulisol New President

worker to be deployed with Doris. "Once the Collective sees our superior strength in cleaning-up capacity, they will run back into the hills, not to be seen for years to come."
