

Voigt appointed as the American representative on the International Advisory Committee on Bibliography, Documentation and Terminology

Melvin J. Voigt, Librarian at the University of California, San Diego, has been appointed by the Director-General of UNESCO, as the American Representative on the International Advisory Committee on Bibliography, Documentation and Terminology.

The 12-men committee, which will meet in Paris for the first time late in September consists of specialists in documentation and bibliography and representatives from the natural and social sciences and the humanities. Other members of the committee come from France, Switzerland, Austria, USSR, Mexico, United Arab Republic and Australia.

The purpose of the committee is to advise the Director-General of UNESCO on programs in the fields of bibliography, documentation and terminology. It will concern itself with such matters as international coordination of work in these fields, international abstracting services, cataloging principles and translation problems, improvement of national bibliographical services and special contracts for work in the areas covered by the committee.
