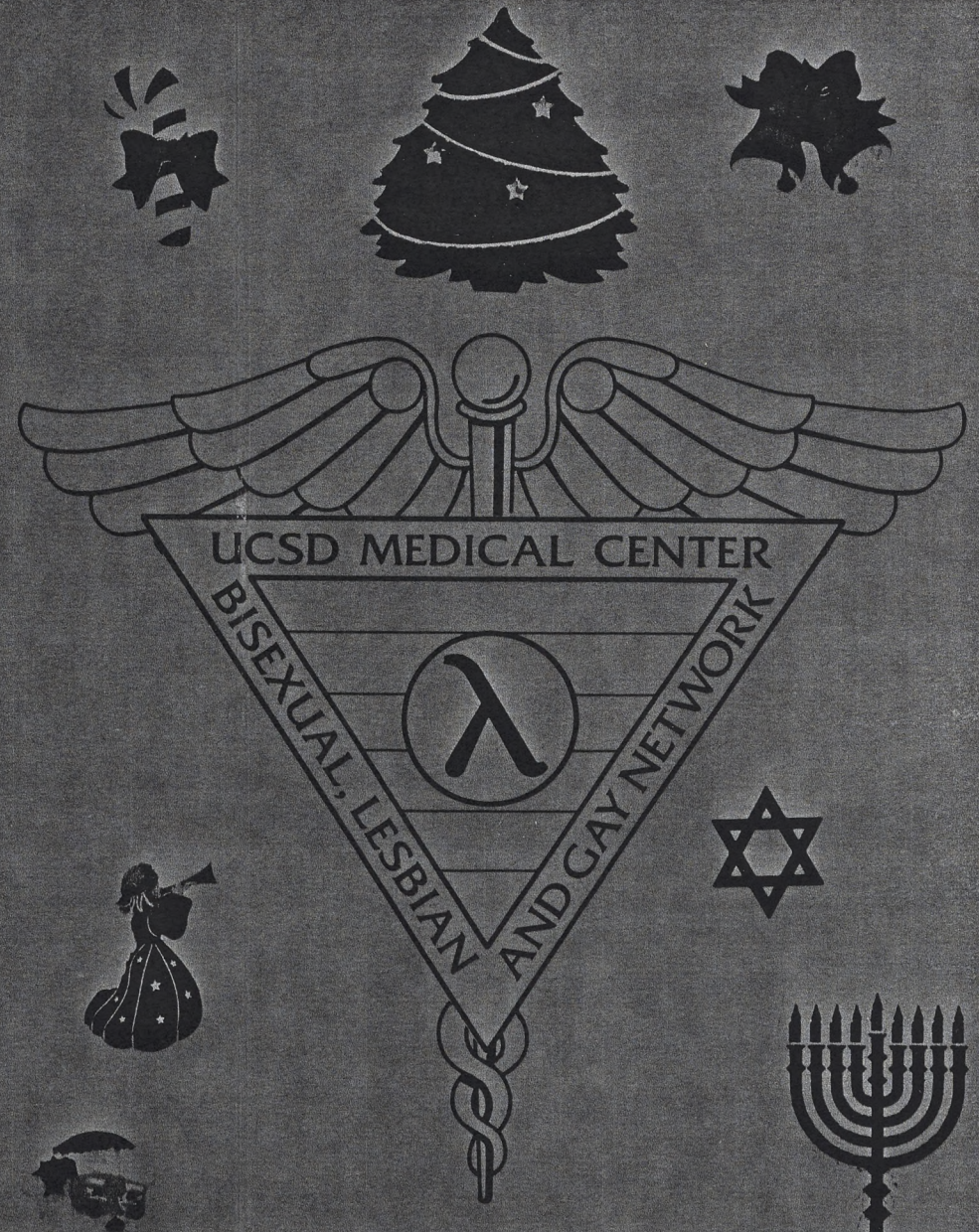
MISSION STATEMENT:

Petition Domestic Partners' Benefits

We, the undersigned faculty, staff, and students of UCSD, urge the University of California as a whole and the UCSD campus in particular to comply with the University's published policy of non-discrimination on the bases, among other things, of marital status and sexual orientation, by reforming its policies and procedures. Current policies and procedures, including but not limited to those pertaining to staff and academic personnel, benefits, sick leave, bereavement, housing, health services, child care, recreation, and retirement discriminate against faculty, students, and staff with unmarried domestic partners, including same-sex domestic partners.

As a first and critical step in reforming UC and UCSD's policies and procedures with regard to non-discrimination on the bases of marital status and sexual orientation, we recommend inclusion, directly or by reference, of the following definitions and clauses in all UC policies and procedures which use the terms "spouse," "dependent," or "immediate family":

1. **Domestic Partners:** "Domestic Partners" shall be any two persons over 18 years of age who submit an affidavit ("Partnership Agreement") stating that the partners have formed a domestic union and that they expect such union to be a "continuing concern" as defined by Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (more simply, the partners expect the union to continue). An individual "Domestic Partner" is any individual who has entered into a Partnership Agreement so defined.
2. **Synonymy:** For the purpose of interpreting all policies and procedures, the terms "spouse" and "Domestic Partner" shall be synonymous and gender-neutral. Alternatively, all references to "spouse" are to be revised to read "spouse or Domestic Partner."
3. **Dependents:** The children and other dependents of either Domestic Partner shall be considered "dependents" and "immediate family" of each domestic partner for the purposes of all policies and procedures.

We believe these policy reforms will: (i) Aid UC in meeting its stated non-discrimination objectives; (ii) enhance UC's effort to acknowledge and value cultural diversity; (iii) facilitate the recruitment and retention of a diverse faculty, staff, and student body; and (iv) assist faculty, staff, and students in securing for themselves equal pay for equal work as well as an environment freer of discrimination and thus more consistent with traditional values of academic freedom, favorable to research, education, and community service.

OVERVIEW:

The UCSD Medical Center's Owen Clinic, under the auspices of the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and the Western AIDS Education and Training Center, offers a "mini-residency" in HIV primary care to physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and nurses.

The mini-residency training program is designed for primary care providers who currently care for or are willing to care for HIV infected patients. Trainees will be supervised by the Owen Clinic's six-member faculty team.

Training includes both didactic and "hands-on" clinical experience in the Owen Clinic, the single largest clinic of primary HIV care in San Diego. The training is tailored to emphasize those aspects of HIV care relevant to the expertise and interests of the trainee. Examples of training topics include, but are not limited to:

- 1) HIV Antibody Testing and Counseling
- 2) HIV Diagnostic Testing
- 3) HIV Disease Staging
- 4) HIV Neuropsychiatric Syndromes
- 5) HIV Disease Management

As a complement to the medical training, participants have the opportunity to interface with the Owen Clinic's interdisciplinary team of pharmacists, psychiatrists, physical therapists, social workers, and volunteer attorneys whose services are vital to the comprehensive care of the patient.

LENGTH OF TRAINING:

San Diego Area Medical Providers:
Scheduling is flexible and participants may take up to eight weeks to complete training.

Out-Of-Area Medical Providers:
Training is designed to be completed in one week.

OWEN CLINIC SCHEDULE:

8:30 AM - 4:30 PM
Monday through Friday

There is no fee for participation in the program; however, all participants are responsible for any and all related expenses (e.g., parking, books, lodging, meals).

CONDOM SENSE QUIZ



Questions:

1. In a UCLA conducted study reported in 1988 for F.D.A, 31 brands of condoms were tested for water leakage, air pressure resistance and package effectiveness. Which brands rated over 78%, which rated less than 65%?

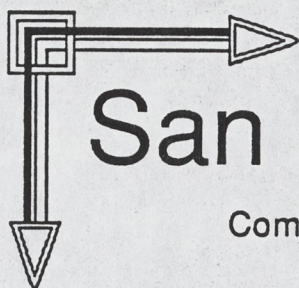

San Diego Women's Chorus

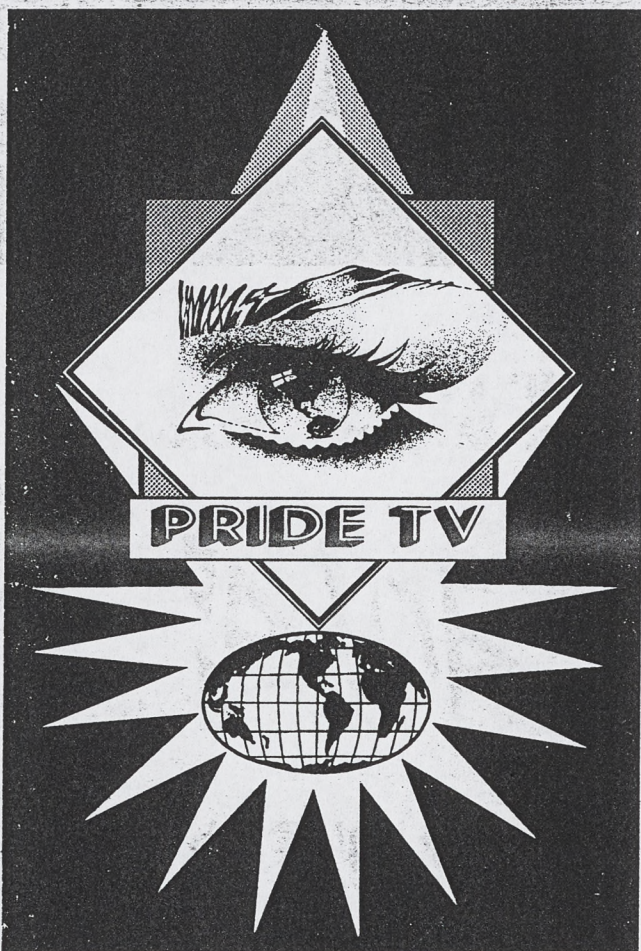
Committed to providing women's music to the community.

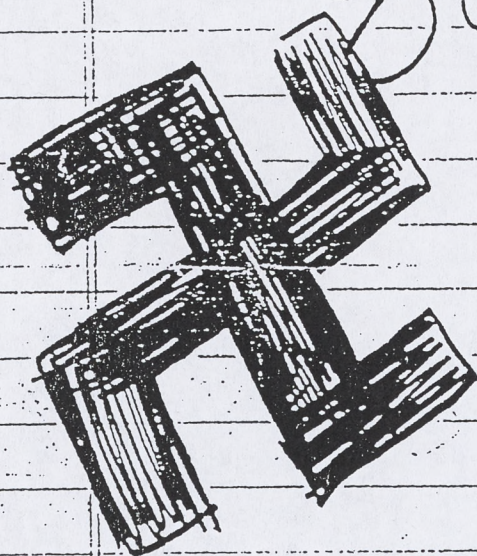

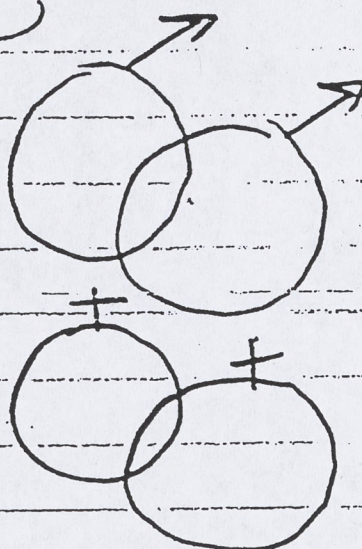

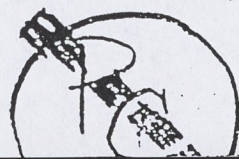
