

Point Hanover. Friday
February 1st 1771

Dear Sir

I have the pleasure of informing you of my safe arrival at this place on Friday the 18th of last Month. Mr Kerr returned here from Westmoreland on Saturday last, where he had been with Williams to take possession of his Estate. We set off tomorrow for St James where we shall stay about a Week & then return here. I hope by the time I go to St James to reside Mr Kerr will have the pleasure of giving you such an account of my Conduct & behaviour during my stay with him as will give you all the satisfaction & Happiness you can desire, & such as I hope will regain that favour which I am afraid I have by my behaviour past entirely lost. I hope by the time you arrive here you will find, that by a constant application I shall be able to execute whatever trust you shall think proper to repose in me; & shall endeavour to undertake the entire management of your Estates should you think

Mrs Med. Woollery is in a very ill state of
Health & returns in this ship to England.
Mr Herr & Family are very well & join with
me in best respects to you & Family who I
hope are all in Health. We have had very
dry weather since I have been here & I am
afraid the same in St James tho' I hope there
was some Rain there to day as it appeared
very much enclined to it. Should there be a
ship ready at St James I will endeavour
to get a Turtle & shall send some Shaddock
& dimes if they are proper. As I have no particular
thing to mention to you will conclude with desiring
