Student Body elections to be held Monday, May 17

The Associated Students of the University of California, San Diego will go to the polls Monday for the second time in their short educational careers.

The occasion is the annual end-of-the-year election to select school officers for the coming year. The current crop of freshman, the first undergraduates to enter UCSD, held a special election last fall to select officers for the current year and to ratify their recently written constitution. Later, a second, smaller voting took place to select school colors and a mascot.

Monday, the students will select student body and sophomore class officers. The new freshman entering next fall will elect their leaders at that time.

Three student leaders, one the incumbent, are running for the office of president of the Student Body. They are: Larry Baker, of El Cajon, who was elected president last fall; Terry Barker, of San Diego, who was elected Chief Justice of the Judicial Council last fall; and Rodney Hurst, of San Diego, who was appointed editor of the year book for 1964-65.

Running for vice president are Miss Janet Albin, of La Mesa, the incumbent, and George Abbott, of Long Beach.

Mark Hinderaker, of Corona Del Mar, is running unopposed for President of Sophomore Class. He was appointed editor of "Sandscript," the student newspaper, last fall. Kathy Bower, of Manhattan Beach, California, and Paul Leonard, of Encinitas, California, are running for the vice presidential post.

The Associated Men and Women Student officers will also be selected as will the members of the judicial council and student body representatives.
