

## **Christian B. Anfinsen chosen to deliver the Fifth Annual Lectureship in Chemistry series**

Nobel laureate Christian B. Anfinsen of the National Institutes of Health has been chosen to deliver the Fifth Annual Lectureship in Chemistry series at the University of California, San Diego during the week of April 17-21.

The series is sponsored by the Calbiochem-Behring Corp. and the UC San Diego Foundation.

Anfinsen, who won the Nobel Prize in chemistry in 1972, will deliver three public lectures. The first, "Process of Protein Folding," will be given at 4 p.m. Monday, April 17, in room 2622, Undergraduate Sciences Bldg. on the Revelle College campus.

His subsequent talks will be "Affinity Chromatography" at 3 p.m. Wednesday, April 19, in room 2622, Undergraduate Sciences Bldg., and "Human Interferon" at 3 p.m. Friday, April 21, in room 2622, Undergraduate Sciences Bldg.

Anfinsen is an editor of "Advances in Protein Chemistry," has served on the board of the Journal of Biological Chemistry and wrote "The Molecular Basis of Evolution" which was published in 1959. He is a member of the Board of Governors of the Weizmann Institute in Rehovot, Israel, and was president of the American Society of Biological Chemists in 1972.

His honors include a Rockefeller Foundation Public Service Award in 1954, a Guggenheim Fellowship in 1958, election to the National Academy of Sciences in 1963 and the Royal Danish Academy in 1964.
