

Dr. Lloyd Smith from Harvard and Massachusetts General Hospital to lecture

Dr. Lloyd H. Smith, Chief of Endocrine and Metabolic Unit, Massachusetts General Hospital, and Assistant Professor of Medicine, Harvard Medical School, will present two medical lectures in the San Diego area Thursday, April 30, and Friday, May 1.

Dr. Smith is coming to San Diego to visit the new School of Medicine of the University of California, San Diego. The School of Medicine, which will enroll its first class in 1967, is headed by Dr. Joseph Stokes III, who joined the UCSD staff last year.

Dr. Smith will talk on "Studies on Genetic Diseases" at 4:00 p.m. Thursday in room 307. Vaughan Hall, Scripps Institution of Oceanography. He will talk on "The Pathogenesis of Gout," at 1:15 p.m. Friday in Lieb Amphitheater, Scripps Clinic and Research Foundation, 476 Prospect Street, La Jolla.

Both meetings are open to the public.

Dr. Smith works in the field of medical research, particularly the areas of inherited metabolic diseases. He received his medical degree from the Harvard Medical School in 1948 and served as an Intern and Assistant Resident in Medicine at the Massachusetts General Hospital until 1950.

He was a Fellow in Biochemistry at Harvard University and the Public Health Research Institute of New York, Inc., from 1952 to 1954 and was a United States Public Health Service Research Fellow at the Karolinska Institute, Sweden, in 1955.

He served as Chief Medical Resident at the Massachusetts General Hospital in 1956 and was named to his present post at the hospital in 1958. He became a diplomat of the American Board of Internal Medicine the following year.

Dr. Smith is a member of the Society for Clinical Investigation and the Endocrine society. He is married and has four children.
