UCSD TO GRADUATE 3,500 STUDENTS AT CAMPUS CEREMONIES JUNE 7, 13,14

Thirty-four hundred students at the University of California, San Diego will graduate June 13 and 14 in ceremonies preceding and following an all-campus commencement June 14 during which Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives Newt Gingrich will deliver the commencement address.

An additional 114 students will receive their medical degrees at an 11 a.m. ceremony June 7 on the lawn west of the Biomedical Library. Jerome P. Kassirer, M.D., editor-in-chief of the New England Journal of Medicine, will be the commencement speaker. Dr. Kassirer, formerly associated with New England Medical Center and Tufts University School of Medicine, will speak on Tomorrow's Doctors: Their Joys and Obligations.

Gingrich will address UCSD graduates, their families and guests at 10 a.m. June 14 on the campus' RIMAC Field. His talk is entitled Goals for a Generation and Research for the Future.

Meanwhile, at 9 a.m. June 13, 675 graduates of Muir College will receive their diplomas in ceremonies held on the Thurgood Marshall Playing Field. Student speakers will give the commencement addresses.

Eighty-five graduates of the International Relations and Pacific Studies Graduate School will gather with some 450 guests at 11 a.m. June 13 in Robinson Plaza. The commencement speaker will be Timothy F. Geithner, assistant secretary of the U.S. Treasury for International Affairs, whose duties include advising Treasury officials on all aspects of international economics, financial and monetary policy developments.

The final ceremony June 13 is scheduled at 2 p.m. for 600 graduates of Thurgood Marshall College on the Marshall Playing Field. George Lipsitz, UCSD professor of Ethnic Studies, will be the commencement speaker.

Following the 10 a.m. all-campus ceremony June 14, the Graduate Division will award diplomas to 150 graduates during rites at 1:30 p.m. in the Price Center Ballroom. UCSD Chancellor Robert C. Dynes will provide welcoming remarks.

The largest group of individual college graduates, 800 at Earl Warren College, will be honored at 2 p.m. June 14 in ceremonies on the RIMAC Field. Student speakers will deliver graduation thoughts.

At the same time, 425 graduates of Eleanor Roosevelt College will cap their undergraduate careers during commencement ceremonies in the RIMAC Arena. A student speaker and a faculty representative will give the graduation addresses.

The final commencement ceremony will be held for 650 graduates of Revelle College at 2:30 p.m. June 14 on the Thurgood Marshall Field. Christine Norris, professor of Literature/Humanities, will give the guest address.
