

The Borodin Quartet of Moscow to perform

The Borodin Quartet of Moscow will perform at 8 p.m. Saturday, April 14, in the Mandeville Auditorium at the University of California, San Diego, completing the UC San Diego Chamber Music Series presented this academic year.

Tickets are \$7.50 for general admission, \$2.50 for students, and can be purchased at the UCSD Central Box Office, 452-4559.

The quartet is scheduled to perform Schubert's "Quartet in E flat Major, Opus 125, No. W" "Quartet No. 8 in C minor, Opus 110" by Shostakovitch and Brahms' "Quartet in B flat Major, Opus 67."

The quartet, named for Alexander Borodin, the father of Russian quartet music, was founded in 1945 by four students at the Tchaikovsky Conservatory. Since the quartet made its first concert tour in 1955, it has established itself as one of the foremost chamber music ensembles in the world.

Members of the Borodin Quartet are Mischa Kopelman, violin; Andrei Abramenkov, violin; Dimitri Shebalin, viola, and Valentin Berlinsky, cello. The concert is presented in cooperation with the University Events Office.
