I got to this Town a Tuesday night last myself
I have not yet been able to bring on my Case with Carjell
there being so much Kings business & so many old actions to
try, we have appointed it to be tried a Wednesday next
When I expect it will be determined, & the weather (how
to put it off till then as Capt Collingwood is just arrived
& I desire to subpoena him being of thing a material
witness, I go to Kingston tomorrow & shall then do all
the business I have to do, that I may be able to come away
as soon as the Case is over, which I shall do by water if
any immediate opportunity offers

Sugar sell well here, some was sold here since I came
up at 30/ not unlike the top of the Market, that I should
be glad you will delay shipping or delivering any for me
till I come down as you hear further from me
no news worth giving you have nothing to add but my good
wishes and that I am &c
