

University of California President David S. Saxon will visit UC San Diego

University of California President David S. Saxon will visit UC San Diego Tuesday, November 25, to meet with members of the Academic Senate. While on campus, he will also spend an hour answering questions in an informal meeting with students and staff.

Reporters are welcome to attend both the question-answer session and the senate meeting. No time is available in Dr. Saxon's schedule for him to meet with members of the news media.

The meeting with students and staff will be held from 2:15 to 3:15 p.m. on the east steps of the Main Gym. The senate meeting will be held from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. in room 2622 of the Undergraduate Sciences Building on the Revelle College campus.

When he meets with the Academic Senate, Dr. Saxon will give a prepared talk and will then answer questions from the floor. Among the questions will be the three attached to this notice, two of which relate to current topics of general interest on campus. One concerns university involvement with the Central Intelligence Agency. Another questions the unequal distribution of state funds among the nine UC campuses-- of particular interest at the San Diego campus now because it affects the ratio of students to teaching assistants (one of the issues in the current Graduate Student Union negotiations with the university).
