LGBTQ Photo Booths

A brief history

The photo booth was an easy and fun way for people to photograph themselves in a private moment whether alone or with friends and loved ones. These photos provided snapshots into personal history, before the days of Snapchats and Instagram updates.

Today, the LGBTQ+ community is more visible than ever: with the widespread use of social media, it's easier than ever to be seen and heard. But in the digital age, it can be difficult to find historical legacies of our community, whether it be the camaraderie within our community, or in the personal lives of individuals. Even with the erosion of homophobic and transphobic laws, being visible still difficult and dangerous at times. But even during the height of these laws, members of our community still documented themselves through photography and other media.

The ONE National Gay & Lesbian Archives, from the University of Southern California Libraries, is one of the largest collections of LGBTQ+ materials in the world.
