UCSD'S COMMENCEMENT DAY TO BE HELD JUNE 17

Commencement ceremonies for 3,100 undergraduate and graduate students at the University of California, San Diego will take place on Sunday, June 17.

Each of the undergraduate colleges (Revelle, Warren, Muir and Third) and the Division of Graduate Studies will hold its own commencement ceremony. Fifth College, which opened its doors two years ago, does not yet have a graduating class.

A total of 2,600 undergraduate students will receive degrees, along with 500 students who have earned degrees from the graduate divisions. Commencement exercises will take place from 9 a.m. through 2:30 p.m.

Muir College will hold the first commencement ceremony of the day at 9 a.m. on the Third College Field at the north end of the campus. John L. Stewart, the college's Provost Emeritus, will deliver the commencement address.

Approximately 700 graduates will receive degrees. Muir College traditionally opens its ceremonies to the sound of the Cameron Highlander bagpipers.

Warren College will hold its commencement ceremony for 575 graduates beginning at 10:30 a.m. on the south lawn between Galbraith Hall and the Mandell Weiss Theatre on the Revelle campus. University Professor E. Margaret Burbidge, an observational astrophysicist at the University of California, San Diego, will deliver the commencement address. Classic Brass will provide music for the ceremony.

The Division of Graduate Studies will hold its commencement ceremonies for some 450 students earning their master's and doctoral degrees at noon in the Price Center Ballroom. Harold K. Ticho, UCSD's vice chancellor for academic affairs, will address the conferees. Caprice Strings will provide musical accompaniment for the event.

The Graduate School of International Relations and Pacific Studies will graduate 47 students at 12:45 p.m. in the Robinson Building, the school's new facility. This is the school's second graduating class. Professor Lawrence B. Krause will deliver the keynote address to approximately 300 family members and guests. Forty-two students will receive master's degrees in Pacific International Affairs and five students will receive certificates of participation in the International Mid-Career Associates Program.

Third College will hold its graduation ceremony beginning at 1:30 p.m. on the Third College Field. Traditionally, each of the graduates will be accompanied by two relatives or friends in the processional, accompanied by the musical strains of Elgar's "Pomp and Circumstance." Congressman Tom Lantos of the 11th District of California (San Mateo County), will give the commencement address to 675 graduates and their families.

At 2:30 p.m., Revelle College will hold its ceremonies for some 665 graduates on the south lawn between Galbraith Hall and the Mandell Weiss Theatre on the Revelle campus. Revelle's speaker will be Clyde Ostler, who was graduated with Revelle's first undergraduate class in 1968. Ostler is Wells Fargo's vice chairman of retail branch banking. His daughter, Jessica, is a member of the 1990 graduating class. Music will be provided by a brass ensemble.

Shuttles will run from the Gilman Drive Information Pavilion to the Revelle and Warren commencement sites from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. For Muir and Third commencements, shuttles will run from northern lots adjacent to the Northview Drive Information Pavilion from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Parking fees will be waived for the day. Visitors may park in any red, green, yellow, or metered zone. Parking attendants will be available to direct traffic. Because of several construction projects on campus visitors should allow time for parking and travel to the commencement sites.
