

asid note, applicant shall make vertical report in writing to the Railroad Commission stating the fact and date of issue thereof and the disposition of the proceeds as required by General Order No. 24, which order in so far as applicable is made part hereof.

2. The authority herein granted to issue said note to be dated February 1, 1917, shall apply only to such note as may be issued on or before 30 days from the date hereof.

3. This order shall not become effective until applicants have paid the fee specified in Section 57 of the Public Utilities Act.
