

"Earth and Life" seminar honors Nobel laureate Dr. Melvin Calvin

"Earth and Life," a seminar honoring Dr. Melvin Calvin, Nobel laureate and professor of chemistry at the University of California, Berkeley, will be sponsored by the University of California, San Diego chemistry department Wednesday, May 31, on the UCSD campus.

The conference will open at 1:30 p.m. in Room 1105, Basic Science Building, with introductory remarks by Dr. Frank Huennekens, of Scripps Clinic. Dr. Arnold Mandell, chairman of the UCSD psychiatry department, will speak on "Organic Molecules and Central Synaptic Mechanisms."

Dr. A. E. J. Engel, professor of geology, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, will discuss "The Earliest Recognizable Biosphere," and Dr. Andrew A. Benson, director, Physiological Research Laboratory, Scripps Institution, will speak on "An Ocean of Biochemistry."

As guest of honor, Calvin will speak on "Solar Radiation and Life."

Concluding remarks will be made by Dr. Murray Goodman, UCSD professor of chemistry, organizer of the seminar.

Interested members of the scientific community and the general public are invited to attend.
