

## Auditorium To Be Named In Honor Of Late Provost

The auditorium in the Humanities and Social Sciences Building at the University of California, San Diego, will be dedicated at 3 p.m. Feb. 11 in honor of late Muir College Provost Patrick J. Ledden, who served as educator, administrator and mathematician for 36 years at UCSD before his death in October, 2003.

UCSD Chancellor Marye Anne Fox and Richard C. Atkinson, president emeritus of the University of California, will officially unveil the signage designating Ledden Auditorium. The late educator's son, Patrick J. Ledden Jr., will offer some personal reflections.

Others participating in the ceremony will be Susan Kirkpatrick, Muir College interim provost; Mary Walshok, associate vice chancellor, and professors Paul Pickowicz and Valerie Hartouni.

A reception will follow in the Faculty Club lounge.

Ledden assumed duties in 1987 as the second provost of Muir College and served for 16 years until his death at age 67. He taught mathematics at UCSD for 36 years and believed the teaching and mentoring of UCSD students was his most important role.
