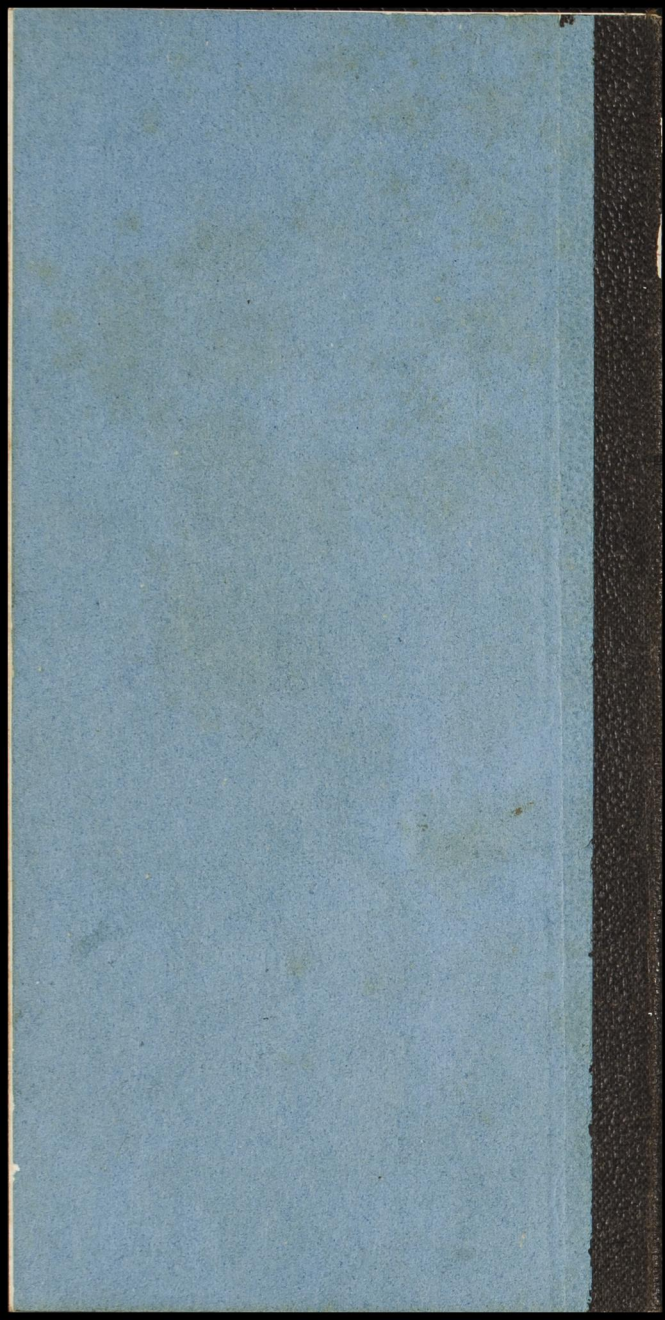

Your rec'd. last night.

I will do as you desire in regard to the coupons paying the premium on gold as it closes in Boston Dec. 31st. Many thanks for the silver Mexican quarters rec'd. I enclose their equivalent in currency. When did you send the twenty cent pieces? I never saw rec'd. them and think some post-office official has derived the benefit. I hope it has not caused you any annoyance.

I should like to get one of each Mexican coin. I have the dollar and do not aim to go any higher (it takes too much money). Our Bank has just declared a 5% dividend free after \$ 5,000⁰⁰ to surplus. I suppose you have heard of our late extreme temperature. Wek ago Monday morning "on the plains" mercury stood 2° below zero, and Tuesday at

noon over 40° above with muddy streak
and the melted snow running in the gutters.

We have had no sleighing yet but I
tonight it is snowing and bids fair.

Hope the lawless bands are not affecting
you seriously as I see reports hinting in
our papers. How is the railroad business
now - Encouraging? With regards and
thanking you for your kindness

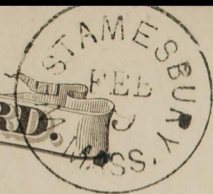
