Becky Cohen, a photographer who is currently a visiting professor in the Department of Visual Arts at the University of California, San Diego, will present a slide lecture on her work at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, November 16 at UCSD.

The slide presentation will be shown in room 2250 of the Applied Physics and Mathematics Bldg. on the John Muir College campus.

Formerly a painter, Cohen adopted photography as her medium in the early 1970s. With her work, she is interested in certain social and political issues as they can be concretely identified within an intimate, often familial setting - or, as Cohen puts it, "in terms of my private ground." Photography, with its capacity for serial observation, provides the artist an appropriate "eye" within which to frame her speculations on living.

The Photographers Gallery in London recently held a 10-year retrospective of Cohen's work. She will begin a series of 10 exhibitions in both the United States and abroad in April 1984.
