
Dear Dr. Szilard,

You are hereby notified that you have been appointed Visiting Professor of Physics at Brandeis University, Waltham, Massachusetts, upon the following terms and conditions:

1. The term of your employment shall begin on September 1, 1953 and continue until August 31, 1954.
2. Your salary shall be \$9,000 for the term above mentioned, and shall be payable in twelve monthly installments of \$750, less withholding taxes and other legally required deductions, on the last day of each month during said term.
3. Acceptance by you of this appointment shall be an agreement on your part to carry out such teaching assignments as may be made from time to time by the President of the University.

Dear Dr. Szilard:


We are very pleased that you have tentatively accepted the invitation to speak to the Friends and Associates of Brandeis University in Los Angeles on Wednesday, December 8th.
