

## **Woodrow Wilson Fellowship awarded to Grad Student David Shevach**

David R. Shevach, a graduate student in philosophy at the University of California, San Diego, has been awarded a Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Fellowship for the 1969-70 academic year. Shevach is one of 217 young scholars in the humanities and social sciences representing 57 United States and Canadian graduate schools.

Shevach, who lives in La Jolla, received his undergraduate degree from Harvard College. The awards are offered to students who give promise of being able to complete a quality dissertation for the Ph.D. within four or, at the most, five years of beginning graduate studies.

A Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Fellowship frees a student for full-time work on his doctoral thesis, enabling him to complete it in about a year. It provides a living stipend and supplementary allowances for special research needs, including travel, and for manuscript preparation. The program receives its funds from the Ford Foundation.
