In P/R-1 submitted by Mr. Uyassi an Area Study Updating is also attached. The updating is incomplete and I will refer this to the Assistant District Commissioner Hoskins to explain as to why certain parts of importance were left undone. These are: SOCIAL GROUPINGS; POPULATION DISTRIBUTION & TRENDS; TECHNICAL & CLERICAL SKILLS; ATTITUDES TOWARDS LOCAL GOVERNMENT; POSSIBILITIES OF EXPENDING THE ECONOMY and ATTITUDES TOWARDS CENTRAL GOVERNMENT.

Portions of the above subjects have been dealt with under the 'Patrol Report' however this Report is not required at H/Q. The Officer submitting the report and the Assistant District Commissioner should have corrected this at Hoskins. The Patrol was conducted in January and February of this year and therefore it is too late to return the report to the officer for resubmission.

C. LAND TENURE

A change in land tenure system is taking place. There are 100 people who own either coconut or Oil Palm blocks. All of these blocks were given to them by the Bank. In case of failure to repay the loan, the blocks of land would become the Bank's property. At that event, there will be change in ownership of the land.

A. INTRODUCTION

Last year was very dry year for this area and as a result there were many bush fires in just about every village in the area. The fire burned down hundreds of both mature and young coconuts.

This year so far there has been enough rain to make all the crops prosper.

There are 32 villages in the West Nakanai C/Division. All but 5 villages are not accessible by vehicular roads. These 5 villages are the ones on the other side of Kapiuru River. They are Ubai, Umua, Bereme, Sampantabil and Malili.

B. LEADERSHIP

The traditional leaders in the area are still leaders. There has been no change in the leadership patterns yet. Lima of Rapuri and his brother Councillor Tomuga are still outspoken in the Kivung affairs. In case of Lima's loss either Councillor Tomuga or Councillor Golomu of Vavua could take over the activities of Lima.

The other leader Boas of Galilo who is the Chairman of West Nakanai Co-operative is also one of the leaders, but he is declining in age and stamina. There is no indication yet as to who would succeed him.

C. LAND TENURE & USE

A change in land tenure system is taking place. There are 162 people who own either coconut or Oil Palm blocks. All of them received loans ranging from 100 to \$ 2,000 from the Development Bank. Assume that all gave those blocks of land as securities in case of failure to repay the loan, the block of land would become the Bank's property. If that ever happens there will be change in ownership of the land.

D. LITERACY

Although there are 5 Primary schools in the area, the number of pupils who have gone through tertiary education is relatively small.

There are two gentlemen who are reasonably highly educated. Major Pattison Lowa from Galilo in the army and Hosea Gaili also of Galilo will be graduating with Bachelor of Economics from the University of Papua and New Guinea during this month.

Apart from those there is John Kassek from Kerapi, he graduated last year as Sub-Inspector from the Police College Bomana. Over half of the people employed outside districts are either in the army or the police. The remaining portion spread between Primary School teachers and carpenters.

2. Mass Media

Not many people read news papers. The Post Courier is available only at J & Co. at Matavulu Platation. But not many purchase, with the exception of Public Servants in the area.

There are quite a number of Transistor radios in each village. See Table 3. Just about every information they get is through the transistor radios. Therefore I recommend that the Hoskins L.C. Council ought if possible purchase number of radios and sell them to the people at cost price. This would at least assist the people to become more aware of the changes going on in the rest of the country.

E. STANDARD OF LIVING

Most of the houses in the area are built of saksak. There is no change in pattern, but still follow the old style of houses. There are number of iron roof houses but they do not take care of them.

All males and nearly all the women dress in shorts, shirts, laplaps and blouses but still few old women wear grass shirts.

Sports - both young men and women are interested in sports but because the youths are not organized there are no regular sportings. Recently established Hoskins Young People's Association and Hoskins Community Development Officers, might do something about it later.

F. MISSIONS

Besides the long established Catholics and the United Church, the Jehovah's Witnesses have started evangelism in the area but have not claimed many followers, because many devout followers of the first two churches strongly oppose to its activities.

G. COMMUNICATION

This year no feeder roads have been constructed, but the survey work on the Hoskins-Kinbe road commenced in January and it is nearing completion. Once this new road has been constructed, the road link between Hoskins airport and Kinbe and Hoskins in general will as good as we would hope to get.

Airport - the proposed extensions to Hoskins airport is still in the air.

H. STAGE OF POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT

The awareness of the people regarding the date for self government is quite thorough. However, no one is yet certain of the consequences. The general impression is that the Administration has not done enough for them, so probably the P.N.G. government might do things better. This attitude is attributable to the fact that not many people comprehend the machinery of government.

I. ECONOMY OF THE AREA

This area heavily relies on copra for its cash income and to a lesser extent on cocoa and market gardening.

Situation regarding the economic trees are that in the last year there were not many coconut trees planted, but the following villages did plant some during the last year.

THE SURVEY OF TRADE STORES

A full survey of all the trade stores in the local villages were carried out and it was found out that many of the stores were not well stocked with the exception of few stores which were reasonably well stocked. They seem to run out of stock for about one month or so before they get new stocks in.

In regards to regulations relating to trade store, they keep within the framework and no situation warranted serious breach of the rules, therefore no action was taken on any of the traders at this time.

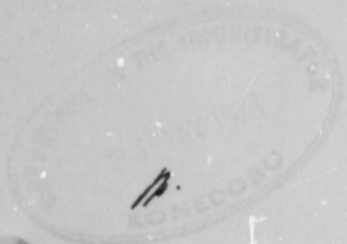
