

## **Faces of Healing Lecture Series begins here**

**April 8, 1977**

A seven-part lecture series titled the "Faces of Healing" that will explore some of the different concepts of healing practiced today, including oriental medicine, will begin Tuesday, April 19, at the University of California, San Diego.

The series, which is free and open to the public, will begin at 2 p.m. each Tuesday through May 31 in Building C of the Student Center. It is designed to be of interest to both pre-med and medical students and the general public and is sponsored by the UC San Diego Health Sciences Advisory Program under the direction of a four-member student/staff committee.

The lectures will feature different speakers each week. The first lecture will include an introduction to the series by Dr. Doris Howell, professor of pediatrics at UC San Diego. It will also cover the work of allopaths and the use of drugs and surgery.

The second session on April 26 will cover the work of osteopaths. On May 3 the subject will be oriental medicine covering acupuncture, acupressure, kiatsu and reflexology. The lecture on May 10 will cover parapsychological medicine including shamans, witch doctors, faith healers and the laying on of hands.

The May 17 lecture will cover new medical techniques such as biofeedback, biorhythm, meditation, visualization and herbology. The sixth session on May 24 will cover preventative medicine including nutrition, physical activities and stress reduction.

The final session, set for May 31, will cover the dynamic correlations between healing institutions and techniques plus an overview of the series.
