

Upward Bound Summer Games

The University of California, San Diego will host more than 800 high school students on July 20 and 21 for the 1984 Upward Bound Summer Games, since the 1984 Summer Olympic Games have bumped the young people from their traditional Los Angeles location, according to Bob Moss, UCSD physical education instructor.

The games are planned with the spirit of the original Greek Olympiad in mind, placing special focus on the combined functions of mental and physical endeavors. The writing contest and the knowledge bowl will test the academic and creative

talents of some 110 participants. Some of the other events are: soccer, tug-o'-war, swimming and track meets, volleyball, Ping-Pong, basketball, backgammon, dominoes and chess.

Upward Bound programs are designed to provide high school students lacking academic advantages and opportunities with the motivation, skills and other resources to assist them while attending a participating school.

The eleven colleges taking part in the sponsorship of the Upward Bound program include: University of California, San Diego; University of California, Los Angeles; University of California, Santa Barbara; San Diego State University; Occidental College and the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. Also, California Lutheran College, East Los Angeles Community College, Imperial Valley Community College, California State University, Long Beach and California State College, San Bernardino.
