

Chief speaker of Charter Anniversary will speak on "Is America Facing Up To World Leadership"

Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt will appear as the chief speaker at the Charter Anniversary exercises of the University of California, La Jolla.

The annual celebration of the founding of the University of California in 1868 will be held at the Russ Auditorium in downtown San Diego on Tuesday evening, March 29, 1960, at 8:00 p.m.

Other speakers on the program will be President Clark Kerr of the University, or his representative, to discuss the progress of the Statewide university during the past year, and Dr. Roger Revelle, Director at La Jolla, who will review events on the local campus.

Admission to the event will be by ticket only. A block of seats will be reserved for University personnel and guests. The remainder of the seats will be available free of charge on a first-come, first-served basis.
