

Dr. F. Thomas Bond has been named acting provost of Revelle College until a permanent appointment is made

Dr. F. Thomas Bond, a faculty member in the Department of Chemistry at the University of California, San Diego, has been named acting provost of Revelle College at UCSD.

Bond, who currently serves as vice chairman of the Department of Chemistry, will begin his duties as provost on August 15 and will serve through December 31 or until a permanent appointment is made. Bond will replace Dr. Chia-Wei Woo, provost of Revelle for the past four years, who is leaving San Diego to become president of San Francisco State University.

Bond has served on a number of departmental and university committees since joining the UCSD faculty in 1967. He has served as an advisor to both undergraduate and graduate students, as a member of the undergraduate curriculum committee and as chairman of the undergraduate affairs committee. He was named to receive the Revelle College Excellence in Teaching Award in 1971 and 1973 and received the UCSD Excellence in Teaching Award from the Chancellor's Associates in 1979.

In presenting the award, the Associates cited Bond's "extraordinary effort outside the classroom that includes careful preparation, good organization, reflection on aims and goals, fairness in grading, and a genuine concern for the well-being of his students."

Bond received a B.S. degree in chemistry from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1958 and a Ph.D. in organic chemistry from Berkeley in 1962. He served on the faculty at Oregon State University for five years before moving to San Diego.
