Dear Sir:-

Replying to your letter of September 3rd inclosing your appointment as agent for the various consumers in the Marlett Tract dated September 1st, the Company accepts this notice and beginning on the first day of September, 1914, the accounting department will render a single bill to yourself as agent.

We assume that after September 1st that we may look to you for all the information including the individual meter readings which are necessary to make up this bill properly divided into domestic and irrigation charges according to the decision of the Railroad Commission of August 18th upon the entire tract and we will hereafter recognize no individuals but deal only with you as agent.

We suggest that we begin this new arrangement as of September first and the first bill which will be rendered to you as agent of the Marlett Tract will be dated October first. Regarding bills due on September 1st and August 1st. we suggest as these bills have already been rendered, that the Company close these accounts with individuals on September lat on their books. In doing so, there may be certain rebates to be paid to individuals and there may be certain delinquencies. In the case of rebates the Company will refund directly to the individual. In the case of delinquencies, we will ask your assistance as agent in collecting these accounts along with your current collections and in case of sustained delinquencies, we would have to reserve the right to ask you as agent to place the delinquent consumer in the "prepay class" as provided for in Rule 5 and pay the Company as agent such prepay amount as is properly dne.


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

Gentlemen: -

We desire to call your attention to three socalled irrigators on the Marlett Tract located within the City Limits of La Mesa.

Mrs. L. J. Drew is the owner of Lots 9, 10, 11, and 12, containing .70 of an acre to which is attached .065 Miners Inch of water, for which this Company makes a monthly charge of 40 cents. On this property some attempt at irrigation has been made, but the actual area is not one-half acre.

G. Brandley is the owner of Lots 48 and 49 containing .53 of an acre, to which is attached .049 Miners Inch of water, for which this Company makes a monthly charge of 30 cents. Very little attempt at irrigation is being made and the actual area irrigated falls considerably short of one-half acre.

F. McRae is the owner of Lots 64 and 65 containing .80 of an acre, to which is attached .074 Miners Inch of water, for which this Company makes a monthly charge of 45 cents. Some attempt at irrigation is being made, but the area actually irrigated Balls short of one-half acre.

In view of the fadt that these consumers are making no decided efforts to irrigate their full one-half acre and their use of water being almost altogether domestic in character, we ask that we be allowed to charge a domestic rate of 15 cents per thousand gallons with a monthly minimum of 75 cents to each consumer.

This tract is supplied through a privately owned pipe line. A plat of the Marlett Tract is attached.
