Dr. Averill L. Liebow gives first PILS lecture

Dr. Averill L. Liebow, professor of pathology and chairman of the Department of Pathology at the UCSD School of Medicine, will begin the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m., Thursday, October 10, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium on the Revelle College campus. His topic will be "Birth and Growth of Collateral Vessels."

A research grant for \$103,501 was recently awarded Dr. Liebow from the National Heart Institute for continued investigation on aspects of the pathophysiology and anatomy of the lung and kidney, formerly conducted in his laboratory at Yale University, where he had been since 1946. Prior to 1946, Dr. Liebow served with the U.S. Army and was one of the first medical people to enter Hiroshima after the bombing in 1945. His account of this experience, which appeared in the Yale Journal of Biology and Medicine, is considered to be as great as John Hersey's much publicized book.

Admission to the lecture is free and it is open to the public.
