appointed by the Chamber of Comm<sup>tee</sup> at a special  
meeting held would respectfully  
report, that after a careful examination of the  
matter referred to said committee to wit  
the matter of resolution to expel B. C. Truman  
from this association <sup>2</sup>and the charge against  
this Chamber that at the meeting of the  
6<sup>th</sup> of January it was passed for the purpose  
of passing certain resolutions, and <sup>1</sup>the

They have come to the conclusion <sup>1</sup>that although
