# **Transcription:**

I am honored to join in marking Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Community Center Awareness Day on October 19.


Validating and Awakening Ancestral Anger




# TUESDAY, NOV. 10<sup>TH</sup> 2015 JENNICET GUTIÉRREZ: TRANS & QUEER LIBERATION
