





## World AIDS Day event at UC San Diego | December 1, 2015

### Price Center Ballroom East

- noon – 9 pm **AIDS Memorial Quilt**  
UC San Diego showcases sections of the AIDS Memorial Quilt. The sections on display emerged from San Diego organizations and individuals as they have responded to the AIDS crisis. Live music presented throughout the day.
- noon – 9 pm **RADIANT PRESENCE**  
A digital slideshow with images from the Visual AIDS' Artist+ Registry, the largest database of works by artists with HIV/AIDS.
- 12:30 – 2 pm **PrEP Talk with Dr. Kadakia**  
A physician from Owen Clinic, UC San Diego's HIV specialty care clinic, talks about the new once-daily pill to help prevent HIV infections.
- 2–6 pm **Poster presentation**  
*John Muir College Room*  
Learn about current UC San Diego HIV/AIDS research by UCSD faculty and graduate students from throughout UC San Diego—Meet the researchers and ask questions!
- 7–8 pm **Youth Living with HIV**  
*John Muir College Room*  
Hear first-hand stories from a panel of young adults who are living with HIV. Following the panel discussion will be an opportunity for those who have been affected to share their stories on an open mic.

- 9 am – 4 pm **HIV+ STD Testing**  
Family Health Centers of San Diego provides free, anonymous HIV testing to faculty, staff, and students.

### Library Walk

*Black Resource Center*  
The Black community in the U.S. continues to be the race/ethnicity group most impacted by HIV/AIDS. Learn more about the factors impacting this community and steps for prevention and education.
- 2–3 pm **Transgender Youth & HIV/AIDS**  
*LGBT Resource Center*  
One of the populations most impacted by HIV/AIDS are transgender youth. Learn the latest statistics and just how disproportionately affected they are.
- 3–4 pm **HIV/AIDS & Women**  
*Women's Center*  
Learn more about the impact of HIV/AIDS on women and the role that gender plays in prevention efforts.
- 4–5 pm **Asian/Pacific Islanders & HIV/AIDS**  
*Cross-Cultural Center*  
Even though Asians/Pacific Islanders are not as impacted by HIV/AIDS as other communities of color, this community has low HIV testing rates. Learn how the API community is affected.
