

Registrar Harold Temmer named by Pacific Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers for award

Harold Temmer, Registrar and Admissions Officer for the University of California, San Diego for three years, has been named to receive a Distinguished Service Award from the Pacific Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers.

The award will be presented in November at the Association's 45th annual conference in Oakland, California. Temmer was named for his "professional contributions and outstanding, dedicated service to both the regional and national associations." He served as President of the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers during the 1969-70 academic year.

Temmer was born in Springfield, Illinois. He attended high school in East St. Louis, Illinois and graduated from the University of Illinois with a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 1942.

He has served as Assistant Director, Division of Special Services for War Veterans on the Urbana campus of the University of Illinois and as head of the Office of Admissions and Records of the Chicago Circle campus of the University of Illinois.

Prior to joining the staff at UCSD in 1968, Temmer served as Director of Admissions and Records at California State College at Los Angeles.

At UCSD, Temmer has served on the Admissions Committee, the Advisory Committee on Classroom and Teaching Laboratories as well as several committees dealing with student problems and undergraduate affairs.
