

Harold E. Temmer appointed Asst. Vice Chancellor-Academic Services for UCSD

Harold E. Temmer, Registrar and Admissions Officer at the University of California, San Diego for the past four and a half years, has been appointed to the newly created post of Assistant Vice Chancellor - Academic Services for the San Diego campus.

Ronald J. Bowker, Assistant to the Registrar and Admissions Officer at UCSD, has been promoted to fill the post vacated by Temmer.

Temmer has had a distinguished career in the field of educational administration. His administrative positions began at the University of Illinois where he served as Assistant Director, Division of Special Services for War Veterans in 1946; head of the Office of Admissions and Records from 1946 to 1966; and Dean of Summer Session.

He received a B.S. and an M.S. in mathematics from the University of Illinois and has taught at Biarritz American University in France and at the University of Illinois.

He was named Registrar and Admissions Officer at UCSD in June, 1968, after serving for two years as Director of Admissions and Records at California State College at Los Angeles.

In 1969 he was installed as President of the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO) after serving as President-Elect of the 4,800 member association for one year. He was only the third Admissions Officer from a west coast school to hold the post of president since the association's founding in 1910.

Bowker, who served as senior administrative analyst and operations officer in Temmer's office in Los Angeles, came to the UCSD campus with Temmer in 1968.

Bowker received a B.S. in humanities from Loyola University in Chicago and an M.S. in Public Administration from California State College at Los Angeles.

He has taught at Sandwich High School and the McHenry School District in Illinois. His administrative positions include: assistant project director, National Merit Scholarship Program, 1960-61; project director, American College Testing Program, 1961-62; project director, National Merit Scholarships and American College Testing Program, 1962-64; and director, National Testing Programs, 1964-66.
