

Dr. Reginald G. Bickford to give fourth Professors' Inaugural Lecture

Dr. Reginald G. Bickford, Professor of Neurosciences at the School of Medicine, University of California, San Diego, will give the fourth lecture in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, November 6, in the Humanities Library Auditorium, Revelle, College.

Dr. Bickford's topic will be "Computer Revealed Reflexes."

He joined the faculty at UCSD in January, 1969, coming from The Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, with which he had been associated since 1948 as professor of physiology and head of the EEG Laboratory.

During World War II, 1939-41, Dr. Bickford served as a physician in the Emergency Medical Service, treating the civilian war casualties in the London Blitz. He also served as a physician in the Royal Air Force in 1941-46. He joined The Mayo Clinic in 1946 as a research associate.

Dr. Bickford received his B.A. degree from the University of Cambridge in 1933, and he received his M.B. (medical degree) in clinical medicine and surgery from the University of London in 1940.

In addition to his teaching duties at the School of Medicine, Dr. Bickford is also director of the EEG Laboratory at University Hospital, editor of the EEG Journal and is serving on the PHS Advisory Committee on the Epilepsies.

The lecture is free and open to the public.

The next PILS lecturer will be Dr. Allen Lein, Associate Dean for Administration and Professor of Medicine at the School of Medicine. Dr. Lein will speak on "The Thyroid, For Example" on Thursday, November 13.
