COMMENTS: Nancy Hanks will give the keynote address of the 11-day (March 6-16) opening festival for UCSD's new Mandeville Center for the Arts at 8:30 p.m. Saturday, March 15, in the Mandeville Center auditorium.

Ms. Hanks is one of the most prominent representatives of the arts in America today. She has served as chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) since 1969. The NEA is an independent agency of the federal government created in 1965 to encourage and assist the nation's cultural resources.

Prior to her NEA appointment, Ms. Hanks was president of the Associated Councils of the Arts for two years. She has also served as an assistant to Nelson A. Rockefeller and as assistant to the Undersecretary of Health, Education and Welfare.
