UCSD TO OBSERVE ANNUAL DISABILITY AWARENESS CELEBRATION WITH A CELEBRATION OF ABILITIES OCT. 12 AND 13 ON THE UCSD CAMPUS

Musical entertainment, free prizes, information tables, a Tattoos 'n' Trivia booth, a food drive and a free movie will mark festivities for the annual disAbility Awareness Celebration Oct. 12 and 13 at the University of California, San Diego.

A Celebration of Abilities will be held from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Oct. 12 at the UCSD Price Center Plaza. Maggie Houlihan, past president of CADRE (Community Advocates for Disability Rights and Education), will serve as master of ceremonies, and entertainment will be provided by Patty Hutchings and Mark Goffeney, both vocalist/guitarists.

There will be a question and answer session with the entertainers about disabilities and drawings for free prizes. The Disabled Students Union (DSU) and CADRE will staff information booths, and CADRE also will present the Tattoos 'n' Trivia booth where participants may answer questions about famous people with disabilities and win a temporary tattoo. Mama's Kitchen collection barrels will be on site for donations of such items as canned fruits and vegetables, canned tuna, pasta, crackers, cookies, Jell-O, cereal packets, rice and ramen. These will be for distribution to men, women, and children affected by AIDS.

The same schedule of events will be held from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Oct. 13 in the grassy area between Torrey Pines Center North and Torrey Pines Center South on North Torrey Pines Road.

At 7 p.m. Oct. 13 Runaway Bride, starring Richard Gere and Julia Roberts, will be screened at the Price Center Theatre. Open-captioned subtitles will provide access for deaf and hard-of-hearing audiences. Free movie tickets are available at the CADRE and DSU booths starting at 11:30 a.m. Oct. 12 and at the Price Center Plaza.
