

Commencement ceremonies to be held on June 14, 1981

June 4, 1981

Commencement ceremonies honoring the graduates of the four colleges and the graduate studies program at the University of California, San Diego will be held on the campus Sunday, June 14, 1981.

Dr. Richard C. Atkinson, taking part in his first graduation exercises since becoming chancellor last July, will extend official campus greetings at each of the college ceremonies.

Approximately 1,850 students are eligible to participate in the ceremonies, including some 355 from Third College, 460 from Muir College, 360 from Warren College and 310 from Revelle College. About 350 graduate students have received their degrees during the past school year, but only about 60 are expected to attend the graduate commencement. Many of the others have left the campus for postgraduate studies or employment.

Third College commencement is scheduled to begin at 10 a.m. on the playing field west of the Humanities Building at Third College. Dr. Joseph Watson, provost of Third College since the acceptance of its first students in 1970, will deliver the commencement address. Sung Man Choe, a biology major, and Amro Andy Nahas, an economics major, will be the student speakers.

In keeping with the tradition of the college, families will accompany students as they cross the stage to be congratulated by Provost Watson and other college officials. A reception for family and friends of the graduates will follow the ceremony.

A bagpipe processional, led by Pipe Master John H. Rosenberger, will open the Muir College ceremonies at 10:30 a.m. at the north entrance of Muir. Dr. Kurt Benirschke, director of research for the San Diego Zoo and professor of pathology and reproductive medicine at UC San Diego, will give the commencement address. Rick A. Jaye, an economics major, will be the student speaker.

Muir Provost John L. Stewart will preside over the ceremonies. A reception will be held in the Muir inner courtyards after the event.

The Warren College commencement will be held on the lawn west of the Biomedical Library at the School of Medicine at noon. The commencement speakers will be Dr. Paul A. Price, associate professor of biology, and student Mark D. Williams, a political science major. Their theme will be "Confronting the Challenges of the '80s."

Warren Provost Lea Rudee will confer degrees and present awards for outstanding achievement. A reception will follow the ceremony.

Dr. William McGill, former chancellor of UC San Diego and recently retired president of Columbia University in New York City, will be the commencement speaker for the graduate studies ceremonies at noon in the Mandeville Center Auditorium. Dr. Manuel Rotenberg, dean of graduate studies and research, will present the degrees. As in past years, dissertation advisers will assist in the hooding of their doctoral candidates.

The Revelle College commencement will begin at I p.m. on the lawn south of the Humanities-Library Building at Revelle. The ceremony will be opened with a greeting from Dr. Roger Revelle, for whom the college is named.

Dr. Walter Massey, director of the Argonne National Laboratory in Illinois, will give the commencement address and Anthony S. Pineda, a double major in animal physiology and sociology who is from the Philippines, will give the concluding remarks.

Revelle degrees will be conferred by Provost Chia-Wei Woo. A reception for graduates, families and friends will be held on the lawn following the commencement.

A Chicano graduation ceremony and festivities are scheduled to begin at 2:30 p.m. Sunday, June 14, in Che Cafe on the Revelle College campus. The program will include speakers, presentation of honors and awards, dinner and entertainment by a mariachi band.
