\$4,369,000 presented UCSD in November-December

Research contracts and grants totalling approximately \$4,369,000 were awarded to the University of California, San Diego in the two-month period ending December 31.

Of the 36 awards made during the period, 13 went to the Scripps Institution of Oceanography and nine to the School of Medicine. Eight physics projects were funded, and the Institute of Geophysics and Planetary Physics received a major award.

Two NASA grants financed continued research on lunar rocks consigned to UCSD investigators for study. Dr. Eugene Bernstein, professor of surgery, received a \$51,495 grant from the National Heart Institute for work on development of a mechanical heart. The National Cancer Institute awarded Dr. Morris E. Friedkin, professor of biology, \$73,874 for leukemia research, and Dr. Ruth Grobstein, assistant research biologist, received \$21,513 from the National Institute of Allergies and Infectious Diseases for studies of the mechanism of antibody production.

Principal funding agencies were the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, the Atomic Energy Commission, American Cancer Society, Office of Naval Research, Research Corporation, and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.
