A musical performance of The Mystery of Edwin Drood, written originally as a novel by Charles Dickens and left incomplete when he died, will be presented by the Muir College Musical Ensemble at the University of California, San Diego, at 8 p.m. April 9 and at 3 p.m. and 8 p.m. April 10. The performances will be held in the Mandeville Auditorium on the UCSD campus.

The musical garnered five Tonys and nine Drama Desk awards when presented on Broadway. The Muir College version, presented in a hilariously broad theatrical style, will involve the audience in helping to determine the ending to the play about the disappearance of a wealthy, popular young man.

The Muir Musical Ensemble is the only completely student-produced musical theater event on the UCSD campus. This year's production is directed by seniors Jocelyn Alexander and Chida Chaemchang and includes a production team of 20, as well as a talented cast of actors.
