

Editors Note - listing of UCSD faculty members receiving honors and awards or publication of scholarly books

Several UCSD faculty members have recently been involved in work resulting in honors and awards or the publication of scholarly books. In an effort to cut down on the flow of paper, we have combined a number of these into a single report for your use now or for reference in the future.

Dr. Stanford S. Penner, professor of engineering physics and director of the UCSD Energy Center, has received the 1983 Thermophysics Award of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA). The award will be presented at the 8th Thermophysics Conference in Montreal, Canada, during June 1983. Penner was cited "for eminent and sustained contributions to the thermophysics field, especially pertaining to quantitative spectroscopy and radiative transfer in high temperature gas systems."

Alan Schneider, Quinn Martin Professor of Drama, is the first American invited to direct at London's National Theatre. He recently directed the European premiere of Samuel Beckett's new play "Rockaby."

Dr. Judith M. Hughes, associate professor of history, is the author of "Emotion and High Politics: Personal Relations at the Summit in the Late Nineteenth Century Britain and Germany," which was recently published by the University of California Press.

Bernard Rands, professor of music, was chosen by the American Academy and Institute of Arts and Letters to receive an award "in recognition of his creative work in music," to be presented in May.

Dr. James Lee Hafner, currently at the California Institute of Technology, has been awarded a National Science Foundation Mathematical Sciences Postdoctoral Research Fellowship and will study at UCSD next fall. Hafner is one of 21 recipients from throughout the United States to be chosen. The selections are made on the basis of ability of the applicant and the likely improvement on his or her future in science.
