

H.D. Johnson named 1975 vice president of the Western Association of College and University Business Officers

H. D. Johnson, vice chancellor - business and finance at the University of California, San Diego, has been named 1975 vice president of the Western Association of College and University Business Officers (WACUBO).

Johnson, 48, was elected to the post at the organization's 36th annual meeting held recently in San Diego. He will also serve as program chairman of the next annual meeting to be held in spring 1975 in San Francisco and will then be named the 1976 president.

WACUBO has approximately 325 members who represent the business offices of universities, colleges and community colleges in 13 western states. The parent organization is the National Association of College and University Business Officers.

Johnson, former UCSD budget and accounting officer, joined the University of California in 1948 as an accountant on the Berkeley campus and came to the San Diego campus in 1955. He received a bachelor of science degree from UC Berkeley and has done further academic work at Colorado College and the University of Oklahoma.

Johnson of Pacific Beach, and his wife, Janet, have two daughters.
