UCSD PROFESSOR AWARDED SLOAN RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

Elizabeth Jenkins, assistant professor of physics at University of California, San Diego, has received a 1995 Sloan Research Fellowship.

The fellowships, awarded each year to outstanding scientists and economists in early stages of their careers, are based on their potential to contribute to the advancement of knowledge in their particular fields.

Jenkins, who joined the UCSD faculty in 1992, is studying the interactions of elementary particles. She received her Ph.D. from Harvard University in 1989, and did post-doctoral work at UCSD until her faculty appointment. She is a native of Tucson, Ariz.

The Sloan Research Fellowship program was established in 1955 to encourage research by young scholars.
