

## **Frosh applications to be referred to other campuses**

The San Diego campus of the University of California has received a sufficient number of applications to fill its freshman quota for the Fall quarter of 1970, it was announced Monday, December 8, by Harold E. Temmer, Registrar and Admissions Officer.

"Following established application procedures," Temmer said, "the office of admissions will begin referring freshmen applicants to those campuses still accepting such applications."

UC campuses still accepting freshman applications are Irvine, Riverside and Santa Barbara. The Berkeley campus is closed to freshmen in the colleges of letters and sciences and environmental design, but is still accepting freshmen applications for the other colleges on the Berkeley campus.

"The San Diego campus is also closed to freshmen applications for the Spring quarter of 1970," continued Temmer. "However, we are still accepting applications from transfer students at all levels for both the Spring and Fall quarters of 1970."
