unsafe for Riding. but as you have had him so long,
you are the best Judge if he will answer. If you do
approve of him, please to let me know what you think
he is worth if that shall be the price, but if not, be kind
enough to send him to Tattershall's, & let him go for
what he will fetch, & not trouble yourself further about him
