

Florynce Kennedy, founder of the Feminist Party, will speak at UCSD

Florynce Kennedy, founder of the Feminist Party, will speak at the University of California, San Diego at 12:30 p.m. Thursday, February 13, on the east steps of the Main Gym.

An attorney, Ms. Kennedy was also a founder of the National Organization for Women and has been active in the civil rights movement.

She is co-author of "Abortion Rap" with Diane Schulder and is currently completing a book, "The Pathology of Oppression."

Ms. Kennedy, 59, has participated in the activities of the Women's Political Caucus, the Black Political Caucus, National Conference on Black Power and the National Welfare Rights Organization.

During the last two years, she has lectured at colleges and universities about institutionalized oppression, especially of women and blacks. Targets of her criticism have been the courts, the media, the Catholic Church, schools and the family.

A 1951 graduate of the Columbia University Law School, Ms. Kennedy is director of the Media Workshop of the Consumer Information Service.

Her lecture at UCSD is sponsored by the campus Women's Center.
