

Three scientists participate in third National Congress of Oceanography

Three scientists from the University of California, San Diego's Scripps Institution of Oceanography are participating this week in the third National Congress of Oceanography being held in Puerto de Campeche, Mexico.

The Congress, scheduled for March 14-19, is being sponsored by the National Institute of Biology and Fishery Investigations and the University of the Southwest. The program is designed to encourage an exchange of ideas among participants, to discuss solutions to oceanographic problems in Mexico, and to make plans for future oceanographic and fishery research in Mexico.

Scripps Institution scientists presenting papers at the session on marine biology are Dr. Angeles Alvarino, assistant research biologist; Dr. Ralph A. Lewin, associate professor of biology; and Julian K. Miller, associate specialist in biomass analysis.

Papers are also being presented at sessions on marine geology, fisheries, and physical oceanography. All sessions deal with some aspect of the study of the Mexican coasts and seas.

The last Congress met in Ensenada, Baja California, in 1965.
