

Dr. Joseph Gusfield is PILS lecturer

Dr. Joseph R. Gusfield, professor and chairman in the Department of Sociology at the University of California, San Diego, will present the sixth lecture in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, May 15, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College.

Dr. Gusfield's topic will be "Equalitarianism and Education in Two Societies: India and the United States."

Appointed as a professor to UCSD last year, Dr. Gusfield had been a member of the faculty of the University of Illinois since 1955. Prior to that, he had taught at the University of Chicago College and Hobart and William Smith Colleges.

He was a Fulbright lecturer in India in 1962-63 and in 1966 and a research exchange professor at Kaio University, Tokyo, in 1967.

Dr. Gusfield received his B.A. and Ph.D. degrees in Sociology from the University of Chicago.

The lecture will be free and open to the public.

"Biochemical Individuality and Evolution" will be the topic for the next PILS lecture, scheduled for Thursday, May 22. Dr. Nathan O. Kaplan, professor of chemistry, will be the speaker.
