

## **Friends of the Library to sponsor lecture on University Archive for New Poetry**

**February 3, 1975**

The Friends of the UCSD Library will sponsor a lecture on the university's Archive for New Poetry at 8 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 13, in the International Center on the Matthews campus.

Featured speakers will be Dr. Roy Harvey Pearce, UCSD dean of graduate studies and professor of American literature, and Dr. Michael Davidson, director of the Archive.

Pearce spearheaded the development of the Archive which is housed in the Department of Special Collections of the Central University Library. A member of the UCSD faculty since 1963, he has written and edited numerous books and articles on literature.

Davidson is a poet and a member of the Department of Literature faculty at San Diego State University.

The UCSD Archive for New Poetry contains significant publications in poetry since World War II including small press monographs, broadsides, "little magazines" and manuscript materials and a variety of tapes and records.

Individual collections within the Archive contain the work of poets Marianne Moore, Clayton Eshleman, Ken Friedman and Paul Blackburn.

The lecture is the fifth in the Public Events Series sponsored by the Friends to encourage greater contact with UCSD for members and the general public. Mrs. Harold Rose of Del Mar is chairperson of the series.

Some 1,200 persons are members of the Friends, an educational organization which brings together individuals with a common interest in books, libraries and the development of the UCSD libraries.
