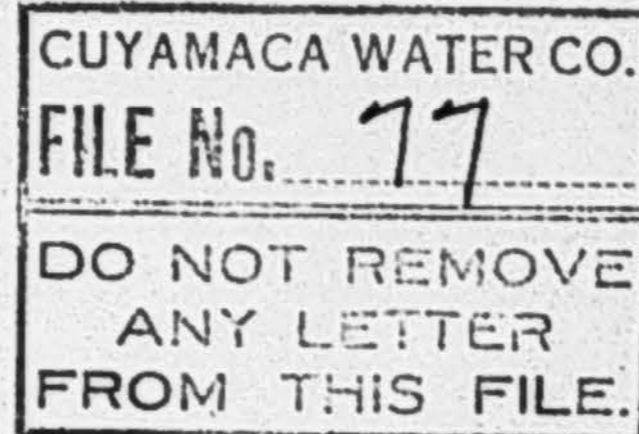

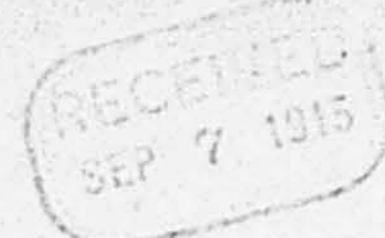

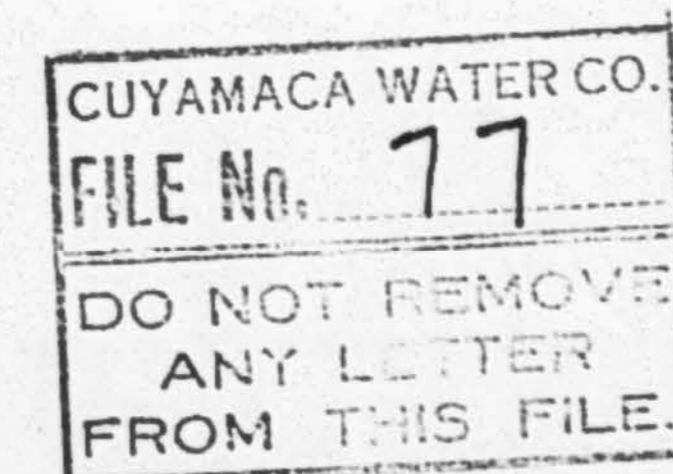

Col. Fletcher expects to be able to take this note up within a few weeks, and feels that the rate of interest should be the same as on the previous note.

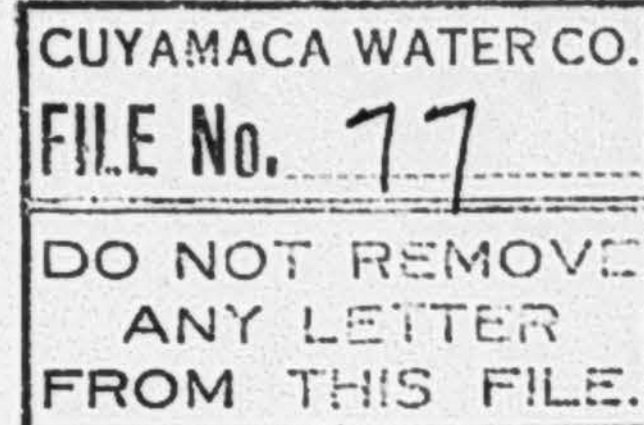

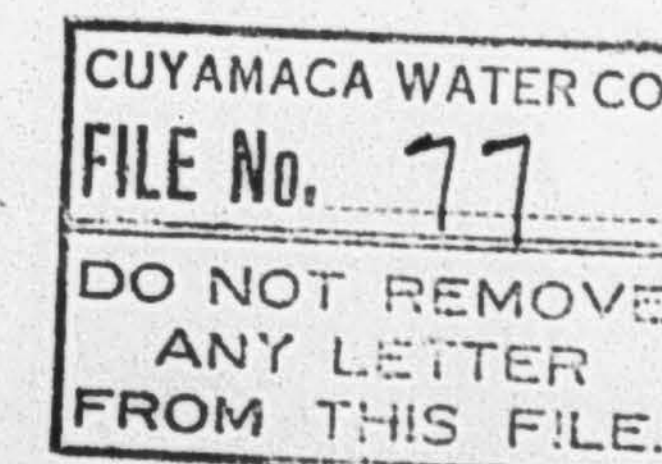

My dear Mr. Hall:

I was talking with Mr. Davis regarding No. 2 and No. 3. The situation is this: the election is set for September 2d, only six weeks away, and what we want is an expression from the back country as regards the relative merits of the two damsites and what is for the best interest of the county.

This should not be a last minute proposition, and I am very sure the best interest of the county will be served by the construction of No. 3. There is only a difference of 15 feet in elevation, if each dam is built to hold 90,000 acre feet, but that 15 feet difference in elevation counts for a lot to the county, because if No. 2 is built to the 365 ft. contour, holding 90,000 acre feet, it wipes out entirely the town of Santee, while if that amount of water is stored in No. 3, the water only comes up to Dr. Good's property and saves the town of Santee, as well as 1000 or 1500 acres of our best land in El Cajon Valley for taxable purposes for the future.

Then again, with the same amount of water stored in either place, the evaporation losses will be over a million gallons a day less in favor of No. 3, because one would flood only 2840 acres while the other floods 3980 acres, and if they should ever build No. 2 up to the 400 ft. contour eventually, about which they are talking, they would flood nearly 6000 acres, and their engineer's report shows they would have to buy 7400 acres, flooding clear beyond Lakeside. The water would come within less than a half mile of the City of El Cajon on the 400 ft. elevation, flooding, also $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles of the San Diego & Arizona Railroad and 3 miles of the paved highway.

Those in favor of No. 2 - their game now is to build the first step to 365, wipe out the town of Santee and eventually go to the 400 ft. contour. In other words, a process of slow death for that community.

I don't think you want to see 3000 or 4000 acres of that best land taken away from development for the future.

No. 3 should never be built above the 350 foot contour at the outside, flooding up to Dr. Good's land adjoining the Panita Ranch. The eventual solution of this whole problem will be a 160 ft. dam at El Capitan and a dam built to the 350

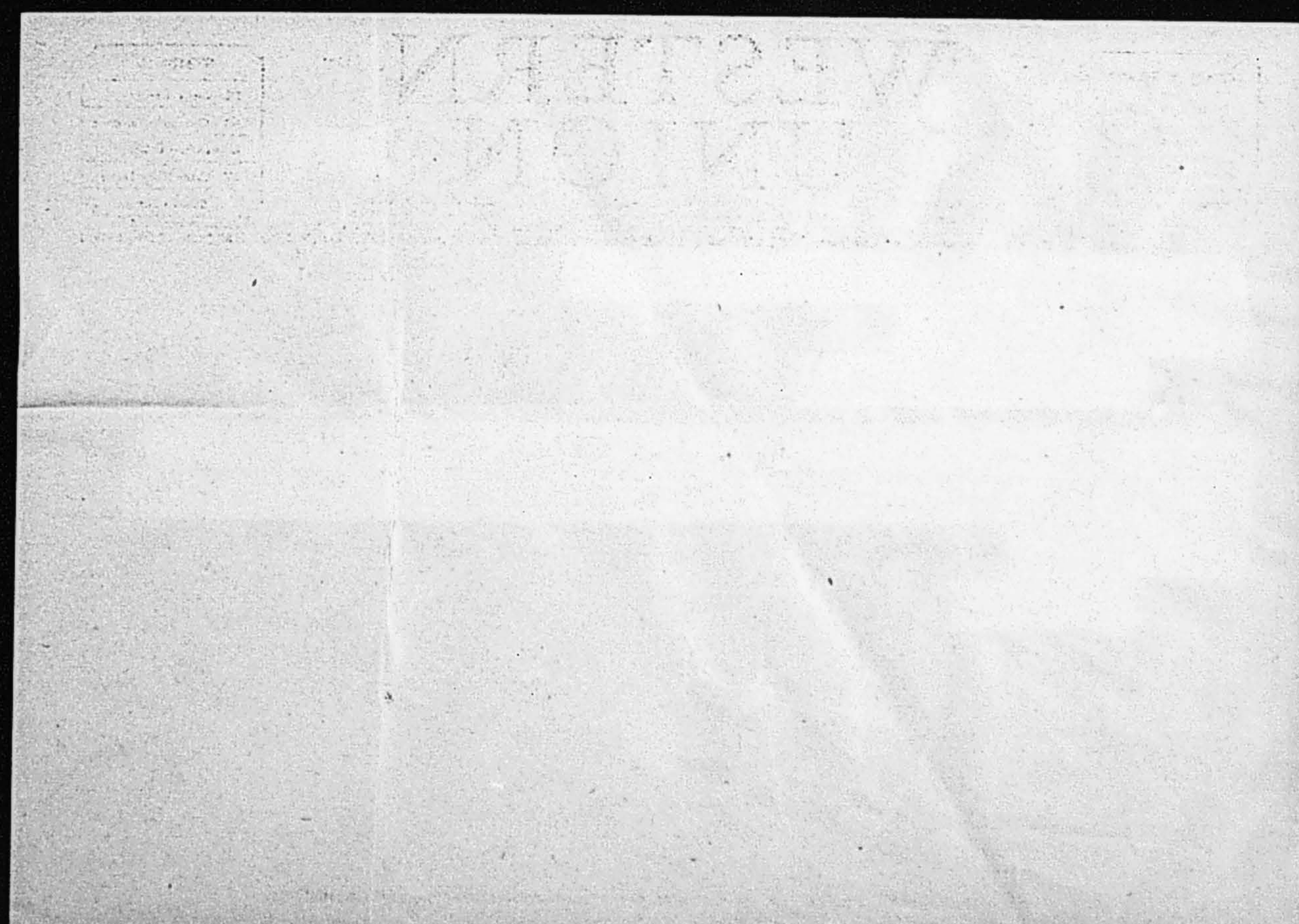

ft. contour at No. 3 Mission Gorge, with possibly a small dam at San Vicente 10 or 20 years hence.
